

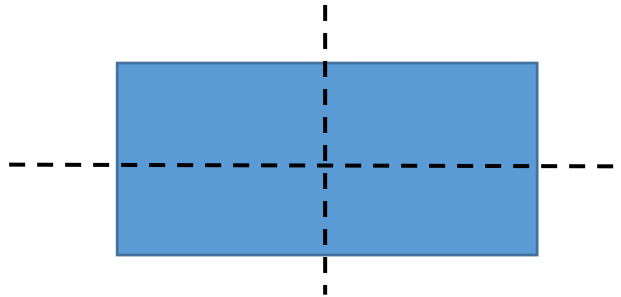
Snowflake Symmetry

An object is symmetrical when one side is exactly the same as the other side. The line that divides the image into two identical parts is called a line of symmetry. Some objects have more than one line of symmetry.

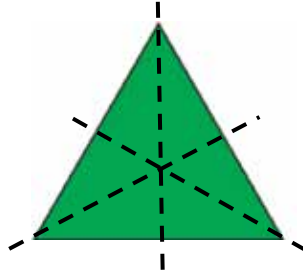
A capital letter A is an example of an object that has one line of symmetry.



This rectangle has two lines of symmetry.



The green triangle pattern block piece has three lines of symmetry.



Make three different snowflakes using the geometric shapes. Create a snowflake with one single line of symmetry. Make another with two lines of symmetry and the third snowflake with three lines of symmetry.
