
## A Remarkable Rectangle

This activity is inspired by Michael Hall's book, A Perfect Square.



A square is a type of rectangle that has four matching corners and four equal sides. A square can be cut, torn, or shattered to become:

A River...

A Mountain...

## Goal:

Cut or tear a square and turn it into a recognizable object. Once you have transformed your square, glue it onto a piece of paper and write the name of the object you created or ask someone to help you write its name.
