COUNT CARS.

Count the red cars you see on your next trip to the store.



## KINDERGARTENERS PLAY



ASK YOUR CHILD TO ORDER TOYS BY LENGTH.

Ask them to arrange a group of toys from longest to shortest.



## KINDERGARTENERS PLAY



MAKE A TOWER.

Ask your child to stack blocks or other objects until they are your child's height. Measure the tower together when your child is done.

## KINDERGARTENERS PLAY



#### MAKE A MYSTERY BAG

Drop several familiar items into a paper bag. Without looking, ask your child to describe their sizes, weights, textures and figure out what's in the bag.



CREATE A REPEATING PATTERN.

After your child has made a pattern, ask them to explain the pattern, and tell you what comes next.





ASK YOUR CHILD TO HELP YOU MEASURE THROUGHOUT THE DAY.

Allow extra time for your child to measure laundry detergent and recipe ingredients.

Help them measure precisely.



## EXPLORE THE WEIGHTS OF FOUND OBJECTS

Collect a group of objects on a walk. Ask your child to predict which weighs most and encourage them to find out if they predictions were correct.





**EXPLORE SHAPES** 

Encourage your child to hunt for and show you circles, triangles, squares, cylinders, and spirals.
